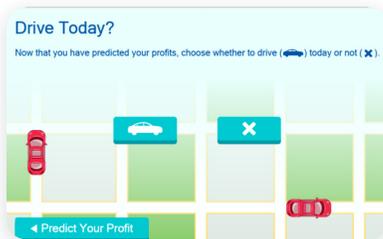

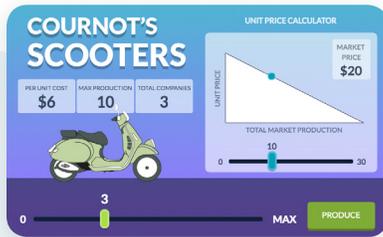
Students face a series of **Utility Maximization** problems and aim to feed a panda just the right combination of sushi, taking budget and marginal utilities into account.
